NOTES FROM THE GALLEY

Reminiscent of a shrimp dish served at raft-ups by CLSC Alum, John Pereira, this is really easy and incredibly flavorful! Use a fry pan on your grille, or in your galley. Serves 2-4, depending how much shrimp each sailor can consume!

1 lb uncooked, deveined large fresh shrimp

2 pkg of Sazon con Azafran

(dry packets - in spice or ethnic aisle)

4 lg garlic cloves minced finely

4 TBS butter

1/4 C olive oil

Crusty French bread (for dipping in the sauce)



Heat and stir all but the shrimp till well blended and thoroughly heated. Turn heat up to medium, add the raw shrimp. 3 min. a side. Do not overcook! Serve in the pan with a loaf of warm crusty bread.
